You are entitled to receive a “Good Faith Estimate” for your expected services. While it is not possible to know in advance how many sessions may be needed or provided to each patient, we have provided this estimate based on what the charges could be for your services as of the date above.

This Good Faith Estimate is not intended to serve as a recommendation for treatment or a requirement that you need to attend a specified number of visits. We’ll recommend the number of sessions after your initial consultation. Together, we’ll decide what’s best for you based on your unique needs. The total cost of services may depend on your progress, how many sessions you attend, and whether you request additional sessions. You’re always in control of your journey, and you can stop services at any point if you choose.

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The total cost of the Undivided Attention Comprehensive Neuro-affirming Evaluation is \$2,000.00.

Payment is expected in full once the evaluation process has been initiated.

A \$500 fee will be assessed as a non-refundable 'deposit' at the Initial Intake Consultation if you wish to proceed with evaluation.

The remaining \$1,500.00 balance is due at the Interview Session.

Description of Services:

The Initial Interview and Feedback sessions are a discovery process not limited to diagnosis. We will be conducting a thorough symptom analysis that will guide the management plan. In the first visit (90 minutes), we'll get to know you better by asking about: educational history, social/relationships, legal history, occupational history, past medical history, medications, surgeries, family history, alcohol and substance use, current symptoms, severity, and areas of executive dysfunction, etc. We will also conduct, time permitting, a brief, limited physical exam including blood pressure, 6-Lead ECG (if needed), and weight. If there is documentation from external providers needed to aid in the diagnosis, you will be asked to sign Release of Information forms.

Testing:

You will then be asked to complete, on your own time, if possible, remote assessments of your cognitive status, mental health surveys, and a character strengths survey. If needed, there is an option for you to utilize time, space and technology here in the office to complete this work for a \$75 fee per 180 minutes.

This evaluation will explore the possibility of ADHD as well as the less obvious presentation of Autism Spectrum Disorder, PTSD, Bipolar Disorder, OCD, Substance abuse, Depression, Anxiety, Sensory Processing issues, Alexithymia, and more. We will also utilize standardized rating scales to evaluate the impact of your symptoms on your daily functioning objectively.

This approach to your evaluation is neuro-affirming and should be viewed as a collaborative exploration of your identity. The goal is to help you align your internal experience of the world with your external experience so that you can become your whole, integrated, authentic self.

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Feedback and Treatment Plan:

If it does not appear to be ADHD, you will receive a thorough explanation of how that conclusion has been reached and provided with resources and referrals for services appropriate to your unique needs.

If ADHD is revealed, you may schedule a 60-minute medication consultation appointment and enroll in the Undivided Attention ADHD Management Program. The program provides you with information critical to your ability to manage your health. This is a pioneering and paradigm-shifting deep psycho-educational dive into the ADHD nervous system, how it is different from a 'typical' nervous-system, how it impacts your day-day functioning and your general mental and physical health. And finally, what to do about it. This takes place over 2 90-minute sessions which are offered as virtual small-group sessions most Fridays.

The goal is to set you up for the best possible outcomes. The evaluation process, and the management program that follows it, is evidence-based and designed precisely for this purpose. ***

Subsequent visits (once the psycho-educational sessions are completed) either virtual or in person, will be either 60-minute counseling sessions, or brief 30-minute medication check-ins depending on your progress, stability, and preferences.

The total cost of "onboarding" 'ADHD Medication Management' with Undivided Attention is \$2450 (\$2000 for the evaluation, \$150 Medication Consultation session, and \$300 for the Psychoeducational Program). The evaluation as described, and completion of the 2 psychoeducational sessions are required for continued medication management.

Timeline:

In the first 12 months after a new diagnosis, it is recommended that we follow up closely.

- In-person evaluation Interview
- Remote testing process and data gathering
- Feedback session within 2-4 weeks from Interview
- Medication Consultation
- Group Psychoed Session #1 – Understanding the Interest-Driven Nervous System
- Group Psychoed Session #2 – Working with the Interest-Driven Nervous System
- 30–60-minute Check in within 4-6 weeks of new medication or medication change and every 3-6 months thereafter.

Frequency of future sessions is dictated by the amount of therapeutic support you wish to receive, as well as medication monitoring. Due to the very common, and quite impairing memory challenges, it helps to keep re-visiting the concepts you will learn in *The Undivided Attention Program* so that you can successfully implement effective strategies, embody what it means to have an Interest-Driven Nervous System, let go of internalized ableism, and heal shame.

If you are prescribed stimulant medications, expect to schedule a 30-minute session every 3-6 months. You are welcome to schedule more visits - this is the minimum requirement and one of those visits must be in-person per year to meet regulatory guidelines around controlled substances.

For non-stimulant medications, visits can be scheduled every 3-12 months depending on stability of symptoms. Most clients seem to do best when they maintain a 30–60-minute session monthly after the Interest-Driven Nervous System deep-dive psychoeducation program.

Additional Services:

Document preparation billed at \$150 per hour. Examples include:

- Occupational or academic accommodations planning
- Disability statements
- International travel medication certifications
- FMLA requests

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Financial Matters:

Services rendered by Undivided Attention are Health Savings Account and Flexible Spending Account eligible. CareCredit is an option for those who wish to have a method of financing the cost of care over time.

After the initial year of service, and depending upon stability, clients may expect one 30 to 60-minute appointment every 3-6 months as long as Undivided Attention is prescribing any of your medications. Thus, the out-of-pocket costs for subsequent year(s) of service may fall in a range from: \$200 - \$600 per year.

If you are billed for more than this Good Faith Estimate, you have the right to dispute the bill.

The Good Faith Estimate does not include any unknown or unexpected costs that may arise during treatment. Actual items, services, and charges may differ from this Good Faith Estimate. You could be charged more if complications or special circumstances occur. If this happens, federal law allows you to dispute (appeal) the bill.

If the actual amount charged to you substantially exceeds the costs listed in this Good Faith Estimate, you have the right to dispute the bill. You may contact us if the billed charges are higher than the

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Good Faith Estimate. You can ask us to update the bill to match the Good Faith Estimate, negotiate the bill, or ask if there is financial assistance available.

You may also use the dispute resolution process with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). If you choose to use the dispute resolution process, you must start the dispute process within 120 calendar days (about four months) of the date on the original bill. There is a \$25 fee to use the dispute process. Initiating the dispute resolution process will not adversely affect the quality of the services provided by Undivided Attention, LLC. If the agency reviewing your dispute agrees with you, you will have to pay the estimated total for services provided on this Good Faith Estimate. If HHS disagrees with you and agrees with Undivided Attention, LLC, you will be obligated to pay the higher amount on your bill.
